



news: transatlántico exhibition by galerie philia is a nod to latin american and european designs

galerie philia is delighted to present transatlántico, a fully immersive exhibition of sculptural design from latin america, taking place in mexico city from 8-12 february 2022.

coinciding with zona maco, the exhibition spotlights the new generation of latin american designers, hailing from mexico, argentina, colombia, peru, puerto rico, venezuela, and the dominican republic, in dialogue with leading designers from europe exhibited in mexico for the first time. in line with galerie philia's core philosophy, [transatlántico](#) celebrates artistry as a medium to transcend societal, cultural, and geographical boundaries, using design to bridge latin american and european discourses and influences within the creative sphere. here are some of the highlights of the exhibition!




