Lionel Jadot, the founder of Brussels design collective Zaventem Ateliers, has transformed an erstwhile factory on the outskirts of Milan into Baranzate Ateliers, a like-minded showcase of handicraft during the city's design week.

Among the artists and makers presenting work this year are Zaventem residents <u>Arno Declercq</u>, Pascale Risbourg, and Pierre Coddens. But the occasion also saw Jadot expand his purview and invite other talents into the fold. Notably, the Milanese design duo Studiopepe was invited to present its first-ever collectible design series, which includes a throne-like chair in charred wood, a low table made of layered onyx slabs, and tubular concrete luminaires through Galerie Philia. Across the way, at Everyday Gallery, Jadot presents a dining table and set of one-of-a-kind chairs fashioned from asphalt slabs he sourced throughout Belgium. It joins a pair of plump fiberglass chairs by Schimmel & Schweikle and two foamy, archaeological lounge chairs by Carolin Gieszner and Theo Demans.
